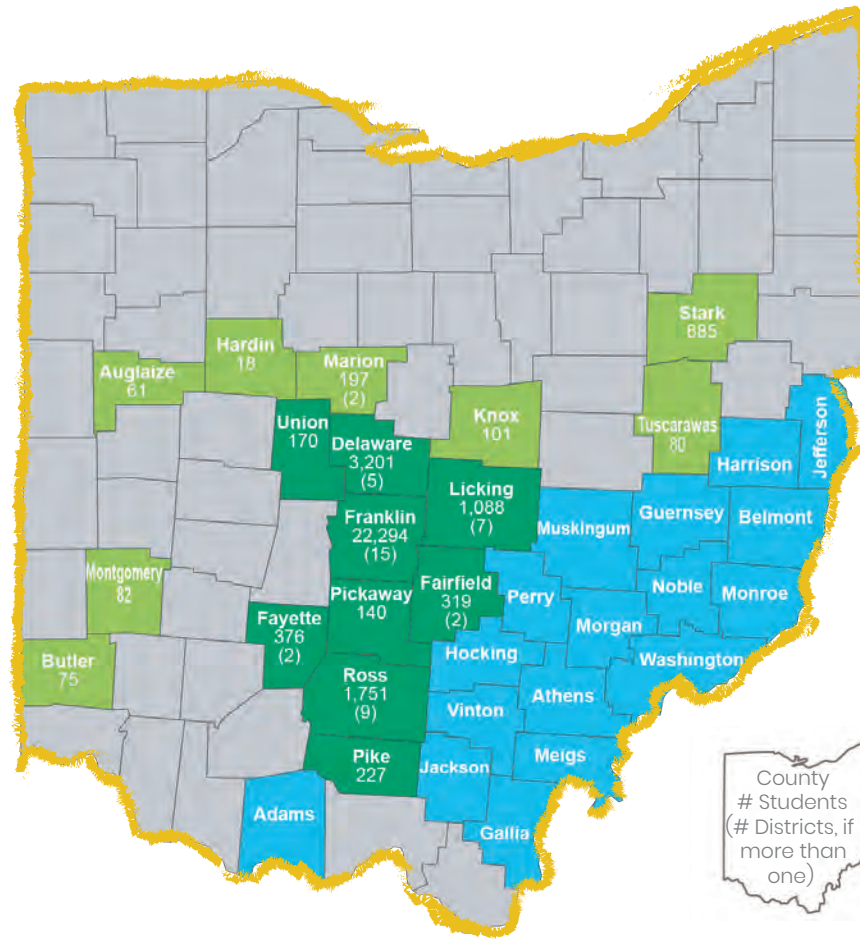

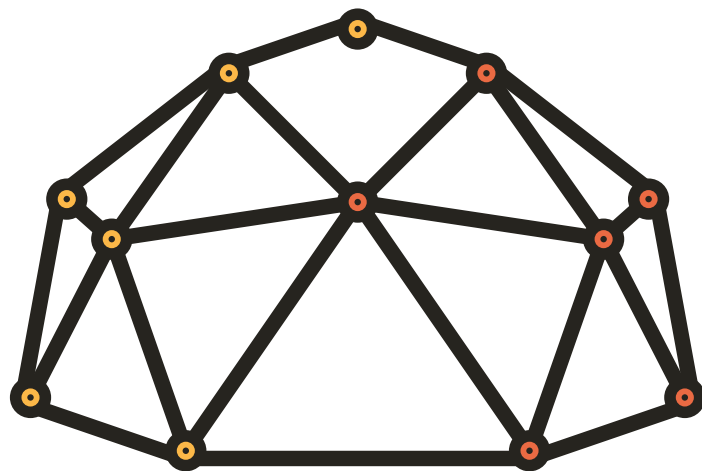

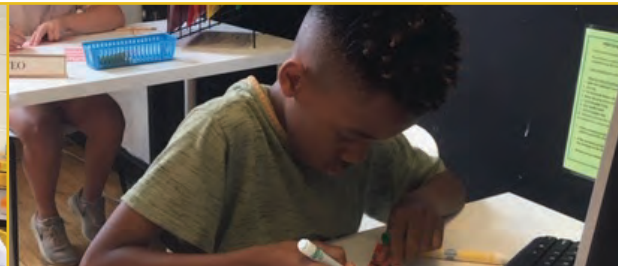

IN-CLASS PROGRAMS

JA In-Class programs are delivered by trained community volunteers. They prepare K-12 students for the real world by showing them how to generate and effectively manage income, create jobs to benefit their community, and apply entrepreneurial thinking to the workplace.

Volunteer Opportunities

JA In-Class programs provide a platform for volunteers to mentor kids in our community while honing professional skills like team management, public speaking and dynamic collaboration.

JA In-Class weekly model includes six, 45-minute classroom sessions once per week for six consecutive weeks. The JA-In-A-Day model delivers all sessions in one day.

JA Our City & Economics for Success (EFS)

JA Our City introduces elementary students to the choices people have with money - earn, save, spend, and donate. JA EFS provides middle school students practical information about personal finance and the importance of identifying education and career goals based on skills, interests & values.

JA Job Shadow prepares high school students to be entrepreneurial thinkers via classroom learning and visits to professional work environments. The JA Company Program unlocks the innate ability in high school students to fill a need or solve a problem in their community by launching a real business venture.

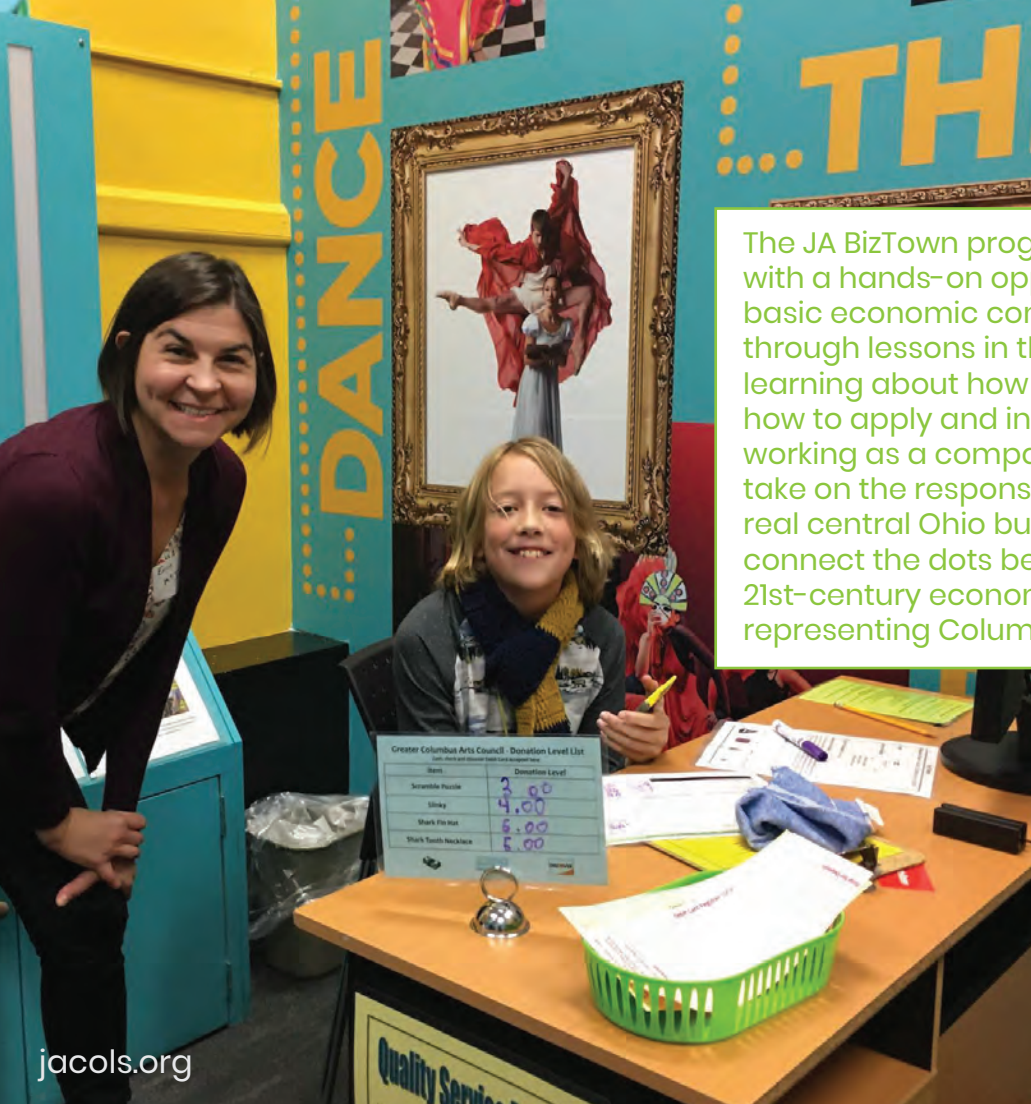
VCC

JA BizTown®

The JA BizTown program provides fifth-grade students with a hands-on opportunity to experience how to apply basic economic concepts in the real world. After going through lessons in the classroom with their teacher – learning about how money flows through the economy, how to apply and interview for a job, and how to start working as a company and team – JA BizTown citizens take on the responsibilities of real jobs in simulations of real central Ohio businesses. The program helps students connect the dots between classroom work and the 21st-century economy through a mini-city simulation representing Columbus.

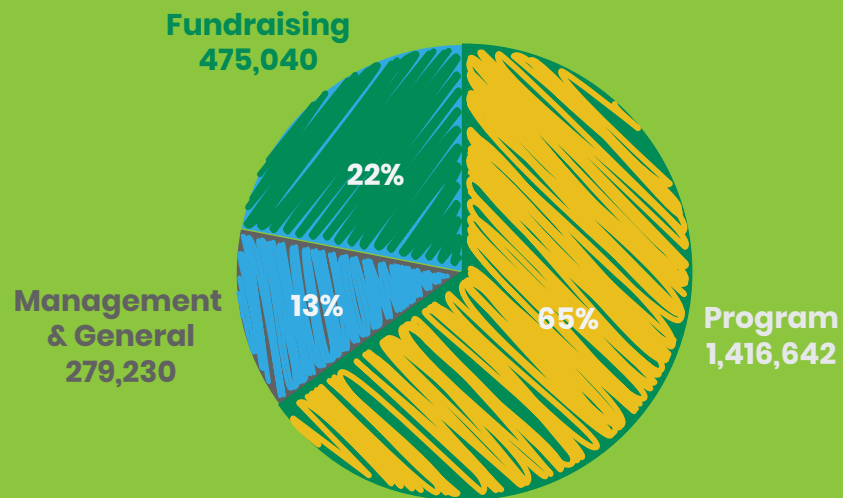
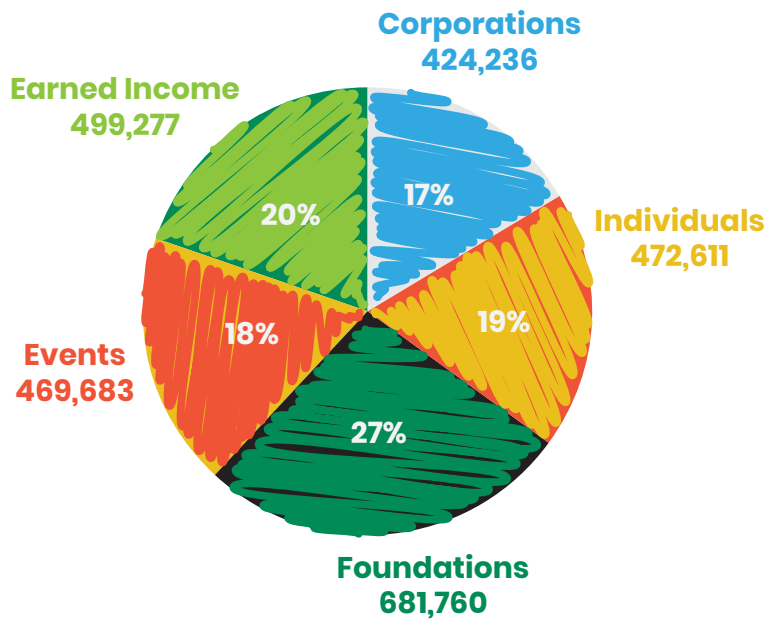

Total Revenue \$2,547,567

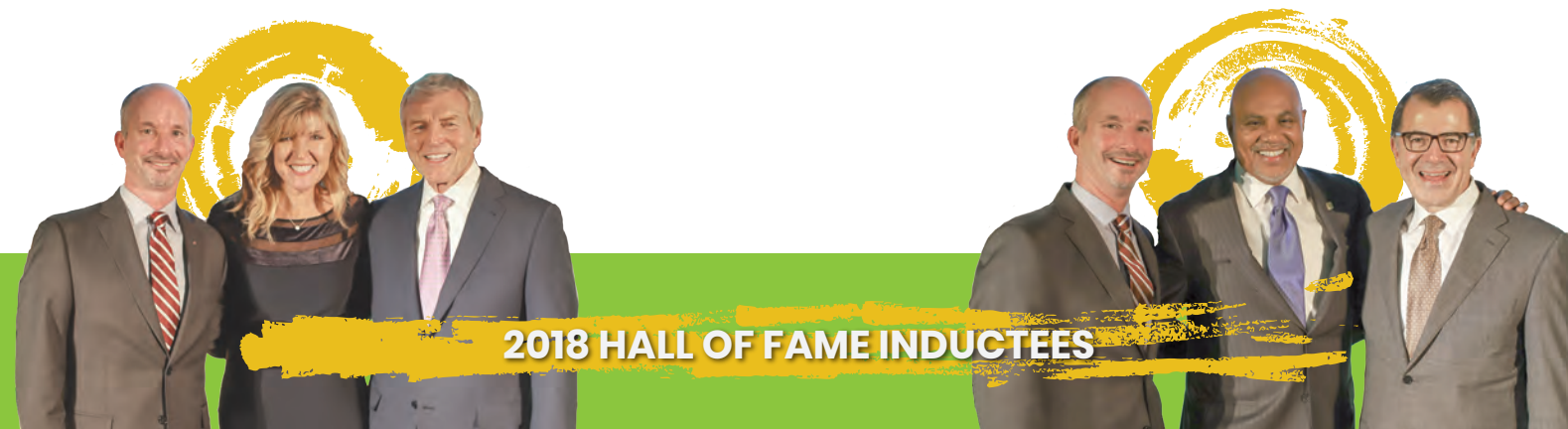

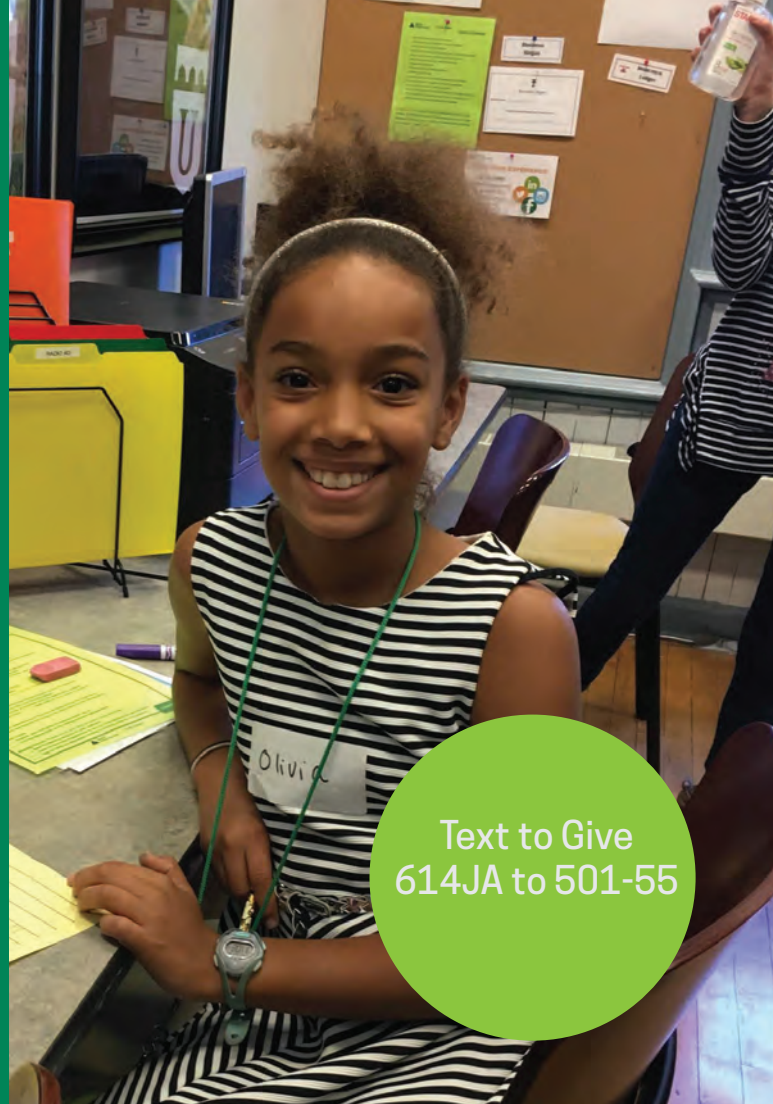
