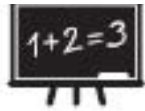

Junior Achievement elementary school programs include grade-specific lesson themes for kindergarten through fifth-grade students, and are designed to teach students the basic concepts of business and economics, while reinforcing the relevance of education to the workplace.

These programs teach young students that people assume roles as individuals, consumers, and workers in their family, community, and the world around them.

Sequential activities build on studies from each preceding grade, setting the foundation for secondary and lifelong learning.
